DSTT Closure

A reminder to all staff that the first of three weekend closures takes place this weekend. Beginning Friday, October 11th at 11:00PM, The DSTT will close until the start of service on Monday, October 14th. The mainline will be divided in half with the north end consisting of service from UW to Capitol Hill station with ten minute headways. The south end service will be from SODO station to Angle Lake (S 200th) station with twelve minute headways. This service deviation will require modified run cards for Friday night, Saturday and Sunday service that can be picked up from the dispatcher.

Saturday, duties 2, 3, 5, 6, 12, 19 and 21 will have earlier start times, while duties 7, 10, 13, 15 will have later start times.

Sunday duties 2, 9, 10, 23, 25, 26 and 27 will have earlier start times.

No duties have later start times for Sunday. SODO station will only have service on the southbound side of the station. Operators operating northbound will cross over onto the southbound track at the YE to service the SODO station.
